has been done and they know that the grizzly population has reached sturdy and safe amount.

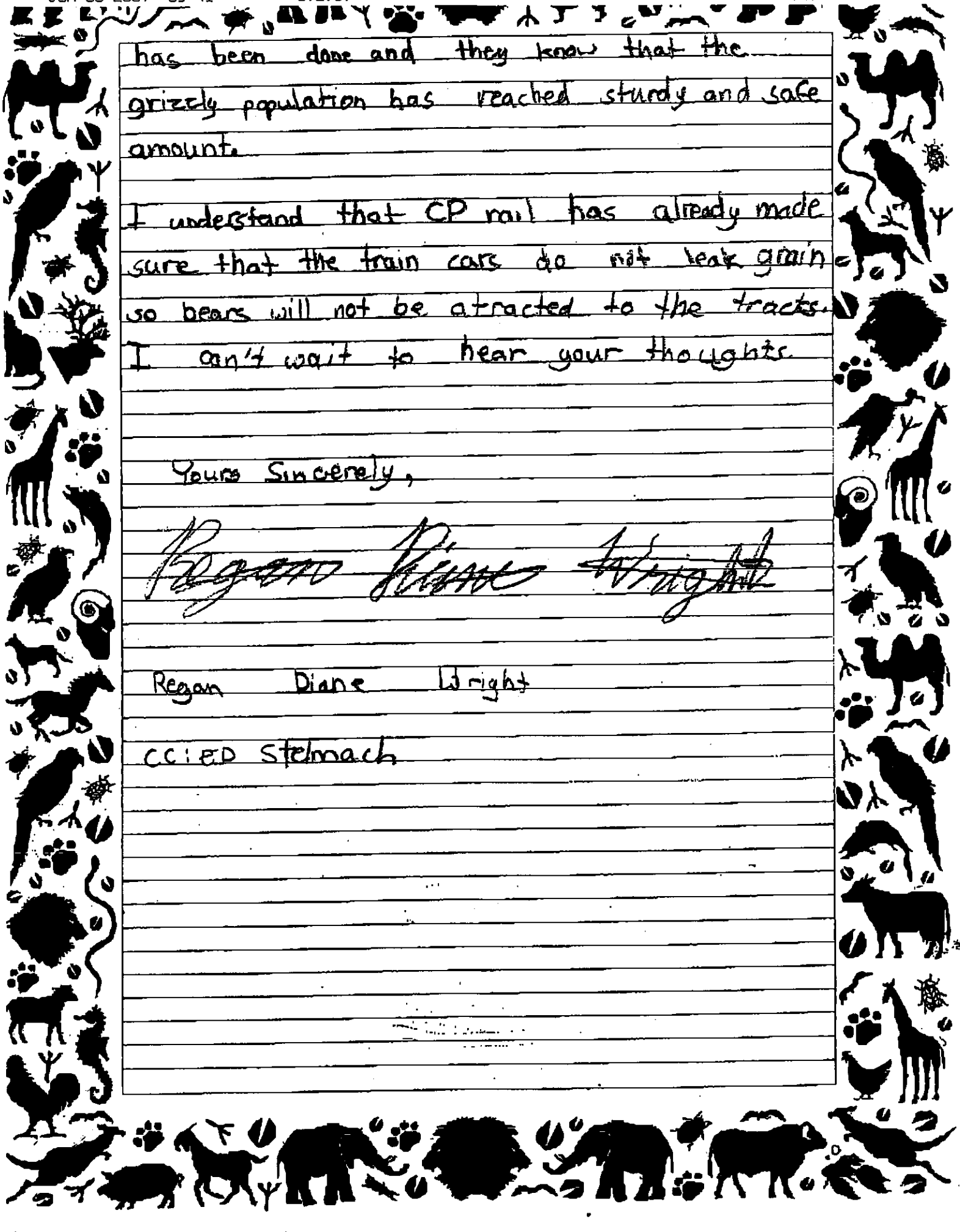
I understand that CP rail has already made sure that the train cars do not leak grain so bears will not be attracted to the tracks. I can't wait to hear your thoughts.

 Grizzly Bears and their habitat.

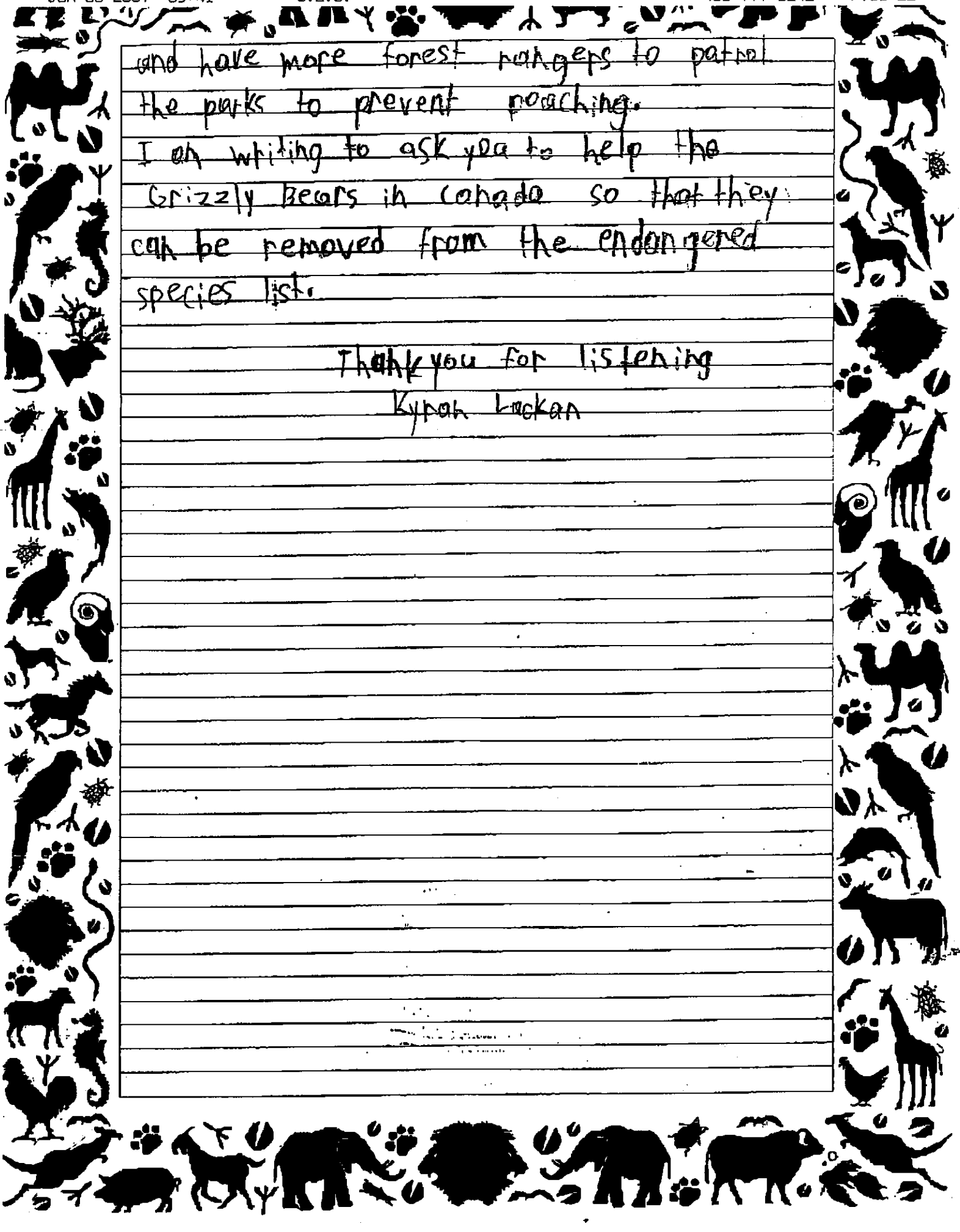
I learned that Grizzlies are an

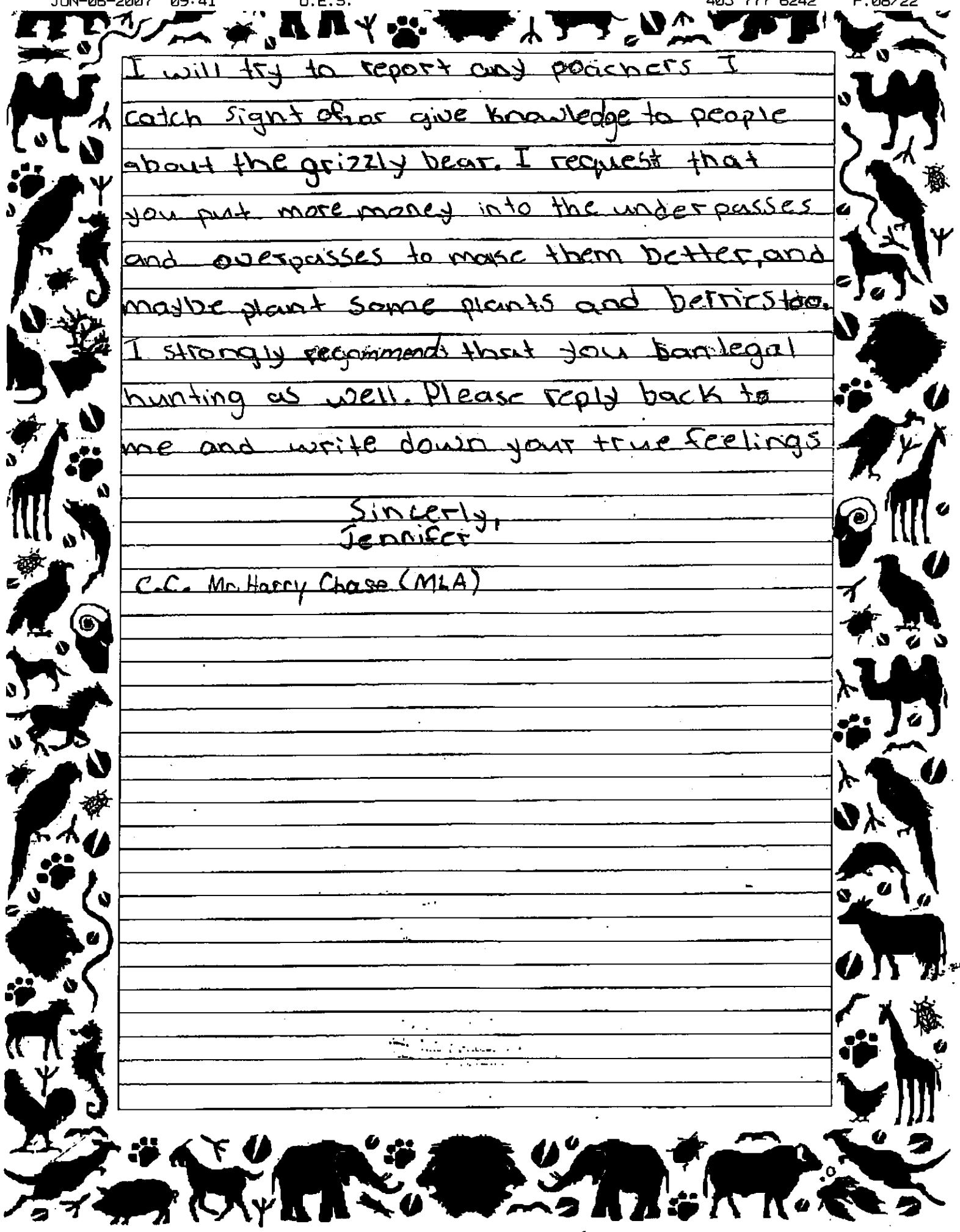
Dear Mr. Morton:
